It has been a busy and exciting time for our family, both here in Jerez, as well as a few weeks back in the states. We have started working with an orphanage, seen more souls saved, been passing out seminary videos, attended a preacher's conference, had a graduation... the list goes on.

Let's start with the orphanage, or more appropriately, the Children's Home. It is named the Bethany Home, and it has twenty-nine wonderful children, and is run by missionaries Bob and Leetha Nicholson, with the help of Alejandro and Juanita, a Mexican family. We have been helping out there in whatever way we can; fixing things, playing with the kids, even helping feed the multitudes. We went out one day to fix a door, but when we arrived, we found a church from one of the neighboring towns had also shown up with about fifty extra people. They needed to be fed, so we switched hats from carpenters to chefs and helped make and serve lunch. We had a great time, but the door had to wait for another day.

When we were leaving for Mexico last June, our Pastor ordered some Spanish movies for us to share with the kids here. When the order arrived, they had included some seminary videos with the other tapes. We had no idea what we would do with them, as we weren't planning on starting up a seminary... we couldn't even speak the language! However, God makes no mistakes. We have met a man named José. He was telling us, "I have been called to preach, but I need to learn how." So, he has been going through the videos and loves them. After two hours of riding in a taxi and fifteen minutes of tire changing, we were back on the road. Then, just a little later, the truck started running really rough and we thought the fuel pump was going out. Praise the Lord, it was only the fuel filter. What we were thinking was going to be a \$300 repair turned out to be only \$6. God is good.
